Architectural Statement: <i>This massive corner building is quite plain with some hints of classical revival detailing at the cornice and pedimented side entry. Executed in local limestone, the angularity of the buildings mass is offset by the arched windows and doorway of the corner entry. An original corner tower was removed and other modifications to the Northern storefront have been made (C). This building is of architectural significance, however, as the largest of the several District buildings executed in local limestone. This stone is difficult to work and was, for that reason, not carved or smoothed. This building shows this characteristic use of the material.</i>	Historical Statement: <i>Only the corner portion of the building was used as a bank. The remaining portions were used as a Hardware company office, store and tinshop (facing Kentucky St.) at the rear. The Bank of Sturgeon Bay's property was valued at \$7700 in 1900 (not extant in 1898 and no 1899 tax roll) The hardware store was valued at \$1500. It was part of the H.C. Scofield Co. H.C. Scofield was one of the most important individuals in Sturgeon Bay's history. H.C.
