

<p>Architectural Statement:  <i>A naive interpretation of the Neo-Classical Revival style, this two-story building is constructed of rusticated local limestone on the first floor with rockfaced limestone on the second. In imitation of a Roman Temple, it has an implied central pavillion with a pediment supported by three cast concrete, Ionic pilasters above a recently modified garage door. A corner "Hose Drying" tower has been removed. Despite the modification this building is interestingly detailed and is the most "Classical" of the number of local limestone buildings within the District. A sympathetic addition (1935 (B)) is to the North.</i></p>	<p>Historical Statement:  <i>Originally a stable and a "lock-up" were at the rear and a wood hose tower was at the NW corner (A). The original Village Hall was located on what is today Michigan Street (Lot 7, Blk.14) The fire of 1880 consumed it, along with most of the Sturgeon Bay central business district. A new Village Hall was erected on the site of 354 Michigan. When the Carnegie Foundation provided funds for the construction of a library in 1910, the City Hall was moved to 38 S. Third.
